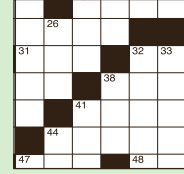

Walter Anderson Memorial Park named

On Sept. 28, the Walter Anderson family and friends celebrated the naming of Walter Anderson Memorial Park on Orange Picker Road with speeches, an unveiling of the new sign and a picnic on the grounds. One new sign was erected and a special historical sign will also be made which will tell the story of Walter Anderson and list the prior names of the park.

The bill for a name change put forward by City Councilman Michael Boylan was passed by the City Council on Aug. 27. Anderson, a World War II veteran, was well-known and beloved in the community.

The park was renamed to reflect the fact that it was given to the county in 1955 by Anderson for \$1 for Mandarin's African-American citizens to have a place to play baseball; this was during the time of segregation. The original name was Joe James Park, then Flynn Park in the '80s, but neither family had any connection to the property. This name change finally connects the park with the man who owned the property and made it a park more than 60 years ago.

Walter Anderson Memorial Park is the first public place in Mandarin to bear the name of an African-American resident.

Miracle on 34th Street is first production of Act II Players

With the inception of the Fine Arts Conservatory, experienced non-profit leader Bill Di Stanisloa has finally realized a dream of providing a true, full community fine arts organization for all ages. Through its Mandarin acting troupe, Act II Players, the conservatory will stage its first production, "Miracle on 34th Street," over the weekend of Nov. 22 at Mandarin United Methodist Church.

As one of the original board members of the former Northeast Florida Conservatory along with founder Richard Dickson, Di Stanisloa enjoyed focusing on the Mandarin area with community music and theater offerings. After Dickson retired, Di Stanisloa was asked by Dickson and the board of directors to keep the Northeast Florida Conservatory going.

"We had a decision to make ... are we going to look at a bigger picture?" Di Stanisloa said. "Wouldn't it be nice to bring a full fine arts organization to the community that also featured art education, art literature, sculpture, painting, dance, music, voice and theater arts?"

So the Fine Arts Conservatory was formed. But the Northeast Florida Conservatory, particularly the theater arts group, still desired a uniquely Mandarin presence.

Word got out that they were looking for a Mandarin performance location and a series of events led them to talk to Tom Boyko, executive assistant to the senior pastor at Mandarin United Methodist Church. Boyko was also looking for a new means of outreach for the church. Mandarin United Methodist has a 450-seat auditorium and was open to the idea of serving as the permanent Mandarin location for the newly created division of the Fine Arts Conservatory called the Act II Players. Di Stanisloa said they also plan to offer theater classes on the church campus in addition to staging productions.

"One of our goals as a church has been to use our worship center to reach out to the community," Boyko said. "Plus, it is our new music director Austen Wilson's dream to build arts and music in our community — we'd like to be known as the arts and music church."

Boyko said that the church's goal is to build a relationship with the Fine Arts Conservatory and the two groups are already promoting each other. The hope is that by supporting a beloved community theater arts group, it will bring people into the church. Additionally, next summer, the church will host a youth music camp in conjunction with the Fine Arts Conservatory.

"This is a perfect marriage of two organizations," Boyko said.

The first production, "Miracle on 34th Street," was selected because Di Stanisloa said they want to make sure they provide quality productions that stick to tradition and are not redundant year after year.

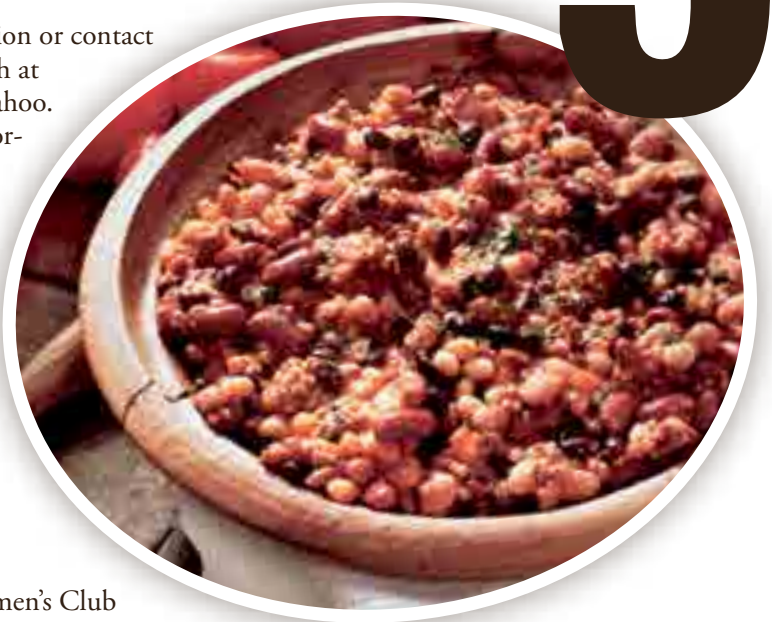

Q: Can you give us some insight into how you view your role with the JEA potential privatization issue?

A: This is such an important issue and a lot of my time and effort is being spent on it. I've become a leading advocate in educating the City Council and also constituents as to what exactly it means to privatize our public utility. We will be scheduling a set of public informational workshops to include representatives from JEA as well as third party experts to give their perspective. Presently as a city council, we are pursuing specialized legal counsel to assist the council in its determination of what's appropriate in this instance.

Q: Before JEA can be privatized or sold, doesn't it require the citizens to vote?

A: Yes. Which is all the more reason for people to become educated to ultimately make this important decision, if the City Council approves the sale first.

Q: What can you tell us about the latest news surrounding the old KMart property on San Jose Boulevard?

A: I have reached out and spoken to both Sun-Ray Cinema and the real estate agent handling the lease. The lessee is confident the deal will be done and they plan to move forward as quickly as possible. Opening could be as much as a year out, though, as they will be undertaking significant renovations. The tiered seating they are proposing requires digging down rather than building up. As I understand it, the property will also contain some restaurants and retail and of course plenty of parking. I think it's a great opportunity for Mandarin to have such a development.

Q: Do you have any updates on public works projects and also the Mandarin Senior Center expansion?

A: Work continues on the Orange Picker Road sidewalks. Phase 2 of this project has begun. Construction is scheduled to start on the southbound right turn lane on Scott Mill Road at Mandarin Road in November. And the Mandarin Senior Center construction is approximately 65 percent complete (as of mid-October), with completion expected by late November.

Q: What do you feel you have learned upon completing your first 90 days in office?

A: I find the spectrum of responsibilities for this job to be interesting; it's all about the micro and the macro. From the micro perspective, I deal with solid waste pick up and periodic code enforcement issues. I make sure that these types of things are addressed in a timely fashion and I rely on my assistant Sonia Johnson for much of this. I've been pleased with the responsiveness of city departments. From the macro perspective, the council has considered a half-cent sales tax for schools, the JEA privatization issue and soon will be considering Lot J. I embrace the challenge; this is not a part time job.

I feel that my role is as a facilitator. For instance, I can't pick up someone's yard trash, but I can contact the correct department to make sure it gets done. Also along these lines, I think a move to make a transfer station near the south side of town is a possibility. This should expedite the yard trash pick up routes since trucks won't have to drive all the way to Baldwin to dump off what they pick up.

Q: Can you give us some insight into how you view the JEA potential privatization issue?

A: I'm sure the readers have seen a lot being written about the possible privatization of the JEA. As they may be aware, council members are currently prohibited from discussing the matter, a constraint I find disappointing and unfair to the council and the newspapers. I have made my feelings known in the past — I am against any privatization of a public utility. A noticed meeting was held on Oct. 8, where all agreed that the City Council should have ample time to review and discuss the process. Also important is that JEA goes out and talks to the community through town hall meetings, so the community can understand what the JEA is trying to do and can ask important questions. The council president decided that a special committee will be put together to review and evaluate the list of companies picked for negotiations, and ask the pertinent questions until the JEA makes their decision next spring.

If it is determined that the JEA votes for a sale in whatever fashion, it must be considered by the council, at which time we will spend whatever time necessary to vet the proposal, and vote it up or down. If it is voted up, then it must go to the voters in a referendum.

Q: Do you have any Parks and Recreation updates?

A: We are at the beginning of a new fiscal year, so we should begin to see significant progress on Parks and Rec projects, and the expansion of parking and building an on-leash dog park, as well as the creation of a park behind the South Mandarin branch library.

Q: Do you have anything else to share with Mandarin readers?

A: At the Oct. 8 City Council meeting, the council approved a bill to immediately close the city's adult arcades. The final vote was 10 – 9 favoring closure. This legislation was not taken lightly by anyone on the council, as we realize it will result in lost jobs and business center vacancies, among other unfortunate outcomes in every district.

I want to make sure our citizens know that I voted "no" on this bill. I voted at the last May council meeting to have the cafes close within six months of the August effective date, and for me, my word is my bond. The six month closing date gave the internet café owners time to close their businesses, and their employees time to find other jobs. I felt that the council had made their decision in May, and the issue did not need to be revisited.

Caregivers connect using today's technology

So many caregivers want and need to connect with other caregivers to share stories and seek advice. Yet, this is difficult to do when the responsibilities of caring for their loved one makes it hard to attend a support group. ElderSource has a solution for this dilemma.

Supported by proceeds from A Night with the Stars, ElderSource launched the Virtual Caregiver Support Group in July where caregivers "meet" using today's technology. Using the internet, smart phones, tablet, iPad, desktop or laptop computers and a video conferencing app, support group members connect face-to-face in real time in the comfort of their homes.

"This technology has allowed us to connect in a convenient way," said Alina C. a support group participant. "Surprisingly there's an intimacy that comes from being virtually face-to-face without the hassle of trying to attend an in-person meeting. It also allows for continued commitment to participate because you don't have to drive anywhere."

The group consists of 10 to 12 participants who meet once a week for 60 to 90 minutes. The sessions are facilitated by a skilled moderator who guides the participants through their conversations. Caregivers need to have internet access, a computer device and the video conferencing app. Participants are given instruc-

tions on how to download and use the free app.

"In such a short time, we've had terrific success with the Virtual Support Group," said Louise Starmann, group facilitator and licensed clinical social worker. "The individuals who are participating in the first group are feeling less isolated and so happy to have the chance to bond with other caregivers 'walking the same walk.'"

Pauline A., another group members said, "I realized, as I reflect, that the group was so important to each other. We build a relationship of caring about the concerns of the other members. You empathize because you understand how each member feels. Providing a listening ear and encouragement goes a long way."

Any caregiver living in northeast Florida can sign up; however, the group is focused on those who feel they cannot leave their loved one to attend a support group but would benefit from participating in one. It is also an ideal resource for working caregivers who are pressed on time outside of the workplace.

The first support group began in July and ElderSource plans to add additional groups based on community interest. Daily steps to keep your heart healthy

Heart disease is a formidable foe. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, heart disease accounts for nearly 25 percent of all deaths in the United States each year.

A healthy heart begins with daily habits that promote long-term heart health.

Issues relating to the heart affect both men and women, and an estimated 15 million adults in the U.S. have coronary heart disease, the most common type of heart disease. And heart disease is not exclusive to the United States, as the Heart Research Institute says that every seven minutes in Canada someone dies from heart disease or stroke.

Such statistics are disconcerting, but they can serve as a wake-up call that compels people to prioritize heart health. Fortunately, heart disease is often preventable and people can employ various strategies to reduce their risk.

- **Keep your mouth clean.** Studies show that bacteria in the mouth involved in the development of gum disease can travel to the bloodstream and cause an elevation in C-reactive protein, a marker for blood vessel inflammation. Brush and floss twice daily, and be sure to schedule routine dental cleanings.
- **Get adequate shut-eye.** Ensuring adequate sleep can improve heart health. One study found that young and middle-aged adults who regularly slept seven hours a night had less calcium in their arteries (a sign of early heart disease) compared to those who slept five hours or less or those who slept nine hours or more.
- **Adopt healthy eating habits.** Changes to diet, including eating more fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and lean protein can help you lose and maintain a healthy weight, improve cholesterol levels and reduce blood pressure — leading to a healthier heart.
- **Embrace physical activity.** Regular moderate exercise is great for the heart. It can occur at the gym, playing with the kids or even taking the stairs at work.
- **Stop smoking right now.** One of the best things to do to protect the heart is to stop smoking. The Heart Foundation indicates that smoking reduces oxygen in the blood and damages blood vessel walls. It also contributes to atherosclerosis, or a narrowing and clogging of the arteries.
- **Eat healthy fats.** When eating, choose polyunsaturated and unsaturated fats and avoid trans fats as much as possible. Trans fats increase one's risk of developing heart disease by clogging arteries and raising LDL (bad) cholesterol levels. Read food labels before buying anything at the store.

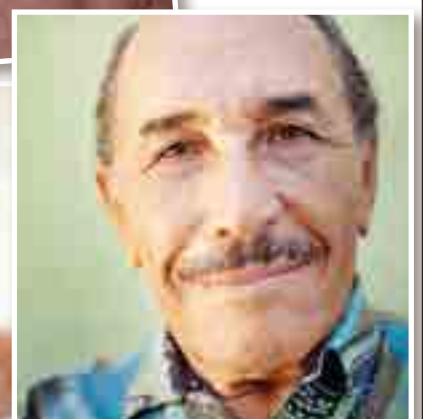

should provide some added excitement.

The recently discovered bell was cast by the New York foundry Jones and Hitchcock. The bell is dated 1855, and one bell expert said that date was the actual casting date and not the patent date as originally believed.

“The bell’s antebellum date makes this discovery particularly exciting,” said Emily Lisska, club board member and Florida Historical Society president. “The Mandarin Community Club was known for much of its life as the Mandarin School and dates to 1872. If the 1855 date is accurate, we have a bell much older than our building.”

The bell is even far older than a previous building on the site, a Freedmen’s Bureau and a school. After it burned, Mandarin winter resident Harriet Beecher Stowe spearheaded fundraising for the current 1872 building, owned by the Mandarin Community Club since 1938.

Back in Time with Brett

RIP Jubilee Hall

It is regrettable to announce that Jubilee Hall, previously featured in the “Back in Time” column in Mandarin NewsLine in July 2018, has met her match as the teeth of an excavator masticated the century-old structure last month. Built in the fall of 1887, the home stood for nearly 70 million minutes to see its grave in a matter of 10. Charles Frederick Winton employed renowned Mandarin builder William Monson to erect the home for him and his family. The home featured a decorative two-tiered veranda, giving rise to its quick popularity as a prominent meeting place for many Mandarin folk

and their families. Over the years, Jubilee Hall saw many hardships and growth alike, as the little village of Mandarin continued on into the 20th Century.

As local supplier and organizer to the overseas shipping business of fruits, vegetables, roots and herbs, Winton suffered alongside the many orange groves of Mandarin in the harrowing loss of trees due to a cycle of harsh freezes during the late 1800s. In 1888, all entry from Jacksonville to Mandarin ceased as the yellow fever epidemic plagued the city; men patrolled the area from Julington Creek to Goodby’s Lake with not a single case reaching Mandarin.

By May 1901, Mandarin opened her homes to refugees from Jacksonville after the Great Fire ravaged the metropolis. Arriving on the steamboat “May Garner,” packed to capacity, the displaced were avidly welcomed by residents. One can assume Winton opened his doors to his wide veranda to shelter those in need over the days after the conflagration.

Nationally, the home saw 132 years of life’s peaks and valleys — 12 states admitted to our Union, 23 Presidents serving in office, two presidential assassinations, two world wars, and the first man on the moon — over the period of three different centuries.

So, what do we do now? Continue on with life. This is just a harsh reminder that nothing in this world is permanent. Time moves forward and old buildings

will be demolished to make way for new ones. What’s important is that we keep their memories alive. The Wintons were prominent members of the community and contributed much to the early life of Mandarin. They went to church at the Church of Our Saviour, their children played in the river, they enjoyed fellowship with their neighbors and worked hard to make a living, like all of us. Their house may be gone, but our community is much more than just one house. We will continue in the efforts to protect what is left of our historic Mandarin structures and exemplify what our ancestors did in the past — enjoying the “Mandarin” moments like sitting for a spell under an old oak tree, strolling through the Walter Jones Park, and admiring the blessings bestowed just by living in Mandarin. Spend time with family and friends because you never know what tomorrow will bring. In doing so, we make our own homes a sort of Jubilee Hall.

A native Jacksonvillian, Dr. William Bosworth was born on the Northside of the city and graduated from Andrew Jackson High School. He attended the University of Tampa on a four-year basketball scholarship and graduated from the Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences on a GI Bill, which he earned during an earlier stint with the United States Marine Corps. After earning his medical degree, he joined the U.S. Navy for active duty post graduate training at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Philadelphia, specializing in general and family medicine. He established his family practice in Mandarin in 1974 after completing active duty with the U.S. Navy at Mayport.

Since then, he has been a very active citizen of Mandarin, serving in numerous capacities with various civic and neighborhood organizations. Among many others, he is a life member of the Rotary Club, a life member of the Mandarin Community Club (serving as president in 2002), a charter member of the Mandarin Museum & Historical Society, and a sponsor of the Mandarin Art Festival. He was elected and served as a member of the Duval County School Board from 1986 – 1990 as well as the Jacksonville Sports and Entertainment Commission from 1981 – 1986.

Dr. Bosworth is presently semi-retired and works part time as a family physician. He is married to Wanda and has one daughter and one granddaughter.

Q: What inspired you to become a doctor?

A: I didn't really have a "goal" to become a doctor. I wanted to achieve the highest level of education that I could and things fell into place. Athletics was a starter and got me a scholarship for my first four years of college and then I worked as a pharmaceutical sales rep, which gave me more knowledge and appreciation for the medical field. I took my pre-medical classes at night in Orlando when I was in my 30s and the GI Bill paid for my med school expenses. One interesting note is that I started my family practice in Mandarin and the office was located where Taco Bell is now ... and there was horse's trough next to the office because at that time people sometimes rode their horse to the office.

Q: How did you meet your wife?

A: We met through mutual friends in Jacksonville. We like to dance and at that time we were interested in country line dancing. Our first date was to the Jacksonville Symphony. We had a long courtship and were married at Mandarin Presbyterian Church, where we are still members. We renew our vows every year.

Q: What do you consider to be your outstanding personal achievement?

A: I would say being elected to the Duval County School Board and achieving the building of four new schools in Mandarin: Mandarin High School, Mandarin Middle School, Greenland Oaks Elementary and Mandarin Oaks Elementary. I had three goals when I was elected: the first was to get the school bond issue passed and repair old schools in the city

as well as build 10 new ones, including the four in Mandarin. The bond issue had failed the year prior and I helped revitalize the support of the NAACP, of which I was a member. Secondly, I pushed for Tobacco Free Schools, which we achieved. And finally, I wanted to expand the extended day care to all elementary schools in Jacksonville for students with working parents. I served on the school board for four years and accomplished what I set out to do.

Q: What can you tell us about your life-long love of basketball?

A: I played basketball in high school and college and never stopped. In my 50s, I started a national program for older players called "Masters Basketball USA" with professional player and Hall of Famer Sam Jones. This is for athletes who wish to continue national competition and there are age group divisions. It has blossomed to include an 80-and-over division called "Geezer Jocks." We started this program due to our love and passion for the game of basketball to include fitness, camaraderie and love of competition.

Fishing

Capt. David's Fishing Report

On Oct. 4, Jim Bagnardi filled his five-gallon bucket shrimping on the St. Johns River near marker #10.

It's not often we get a shrimp run that lasts well into October, but this year we did. Many months of "just right" weather ended up being a major contributor to this year's successful season.

It seemed this year "Honey Holes" were everywhere, and all just seemed to get better from one week to the next. As the shrimping got better the shrimp got bigger. By the time October rolled around, St. Johns River Shrimp were starting to look like Mayport Shrimp.

While we still have stragglers leaving the river, this year's shrimp run is over, but as far as fishing goes, the next few weeks have the potential to be just as good as this year's shrimp run.

Fall fishing is usually pretty good just because it follows our summer shrimp run. Fall fish are the same fish that came into the river earlier this summer looking for shrimp to eat, but are now bigger and fatter. For a successful fall fishing season, torrential rains will need to continue to avoid our areas of the St. Johns River and farther south.

Hopefully some of those St. Johns River Shrimp caught while shrimping this year were frozen and saved for bait. If not, with a little luck, straggler shrimp can still be caught for live bait. Live baby croakers, quartered blue crabs, cut croaker or lady fish are all your next baits of choice for the St. Johns this time of year. And your targets should be reds, flounder,

trout, weakfish, croaker, and anything else that bites.

In the surf, the fall run south for many species of fish should begin to peak soon. This time of year weather conditions make surf fishing more difficult than most other times, but the rewards of some really nice catches of reds or drum are probably greater. Schooling mullet can also be cast netted in the surf as they migrate south. These are great tasting salt-water mullet and well worth the effort.

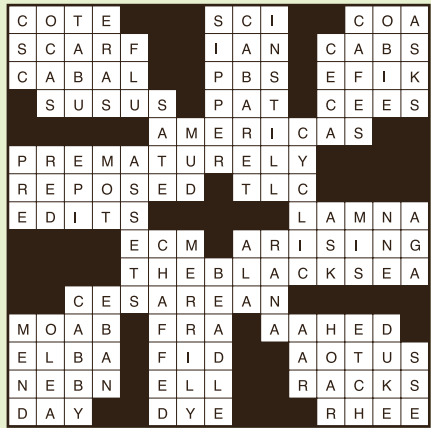
Fishing Report: Reds in river, on docks, and at Buckman Bridge. Weakfish growing in numbers and size. Panfish bite pretty good up in creeks taking worms.

Whether you catch one, some, or none, the family time spent fishing will last a lifetime.

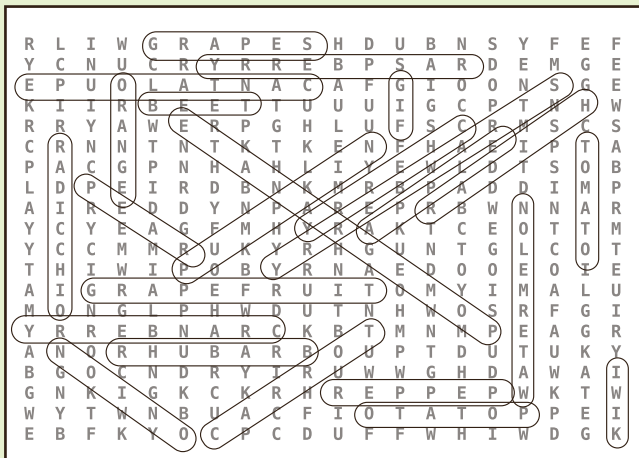

Hospital provides tips on measles

"It appears measles is resurfacing in the US," said Megan Brown, DO, pediatric ER physician at Memorial Hospital. "It is a contagious virus which starts as a fever and can cause serious health complications and even lead to death."

Measles was eliminated from the US in 2000, but New York has seen an outbreak of 1000 cases this year. In 2017, there were 110,000 confirmed cases in the US with the majority of

those affected being younger than five years of age.

"The vaccine which is first given between 12 – 15 months of age is 97 percent effective against the virus," said Dr. Brown. Prior to the availability of the vaccine, there were an estimated 2.6 million deaths each year from the virus. "It remains the leading cause of death in children less than five years of age worldwide."

Measles is spread by droplets, which means when someone coughs, anyone within six feet has the potential to catch the virus which can remain in the air for up to two hours. It then takes six to 21 days before symptoms will start to appear. The infected person is contagious starting five days before the appearance of a rash.

The symptoms of measles include fever, malaise (being tired), and not wanting to eat. These symptoms are followed by a cough, irritation to the eyes, and nasal congestion. The rash typically appears two to four days after the fever.

If you suspect you or your child may have measles and have not been vaccinated, seek medical attention immediately. The measles vaccines can be administered by a pediatrician or primary care physician. Visit <https://memorialhospitaljax.com/service/family-medicine> for more information.

Gardening

Enough of the heat!

In the first week of October we were still experiencing record-breaking temperatures, along with the rest of the south and east. In the first half of September we had adequate rains, but by the end of the month we were in a moderate drought; it does make a garden harder to manage when conditions are so out of the norm.

Thankfully, the heat is forecast to break, and rain really is on its way. We should soon be able to enjoy cool season annuals, like mums (chrysanthemums) and violas. Greens are some of the vegetables that benefit from cooler weather, and many of them are attractive enough to replace the usual ornamental cabbage. Pretty edibles for the flower border include kales and Swiss chard, and herbs like rosemary, sage, onion chives, and cilantro. Chard is sometimes sold in the ornamental section of big box stores, but they may have been treated with pesticides which could make them inedible. Not all pesticides formulated for ornamentals can be used for growing edibles, so it is safer to buy plants from the vegetable section.

I recently read an article about plant blindness, which explained that many people simply don't see the plants around them, don't know much about their place in the world, and therefore have little idea of their fundamental value to our existence (see <https://tinyurl.com/y5ct-nv85>). As children, we almost all learn about the living world in relation to animals: we have pets, visit the zoo, and read books with animal characters. It's only

if parents are gardeners, or enjoy visiting parks and gardens, and encourage their children to discover the plants around them that children learn to appreciate, understand, and enjoy them.

The Japanese believe that "forest bathing" — shinrin-yoku — is a great healer, and designate areas with walks and benches to encourage people to relax and soak in the peace and tranquility (see <https://tinyurl.com/y6kneueq>). All you really need are trees, of which we are lucky to have plenty in Jacksonville, and some "me time." In the UK, family doctors may write prescriptions for people with emotional problems, or who are simply lonely, connecting them with outdoor activities like group walks, or community gardening projects.

Duval County Extension manages several community gardens around town. For anyone who has ever hankered after a plot of their own, this can be a great solution. The Extension Service takes applications from any resident, on a first-come-first-served basis. School and community groups can get advice on setting up their own gardens. 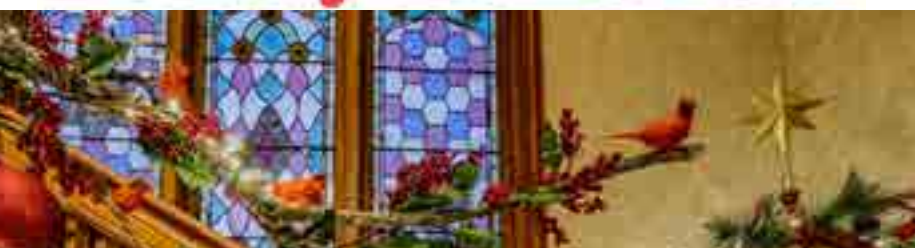
